FINANCIAL ITEM NO. 7B-1

Approval of Agreement with Boettcher Brewery Consultant LLC

Purpose:

- Provide brewer certifications for Journeyman Brewer and Technical Brewer programs (the only programs of their kind in the state of Texas) through face-to-face, hybrid, and online instruction.
- Provide a sensory evaluation course for community members and businesses that are in the restaurant/food/liquor industry
- Supply the brewery industry with qualified employees to meet demand for certified brewers

The chancellor recommends authorization be given to approve an agreement with Boettcher Brewery Consultant LLC to train brewery students in the aforementioned areas for the period February 1, 2017 through December 31, 2019. Eastfield College will pay Boettcher Brewery Consultant LLC an amount not to exceed \$1,101,240. This agreement will provide services for approximately 750 students enrolled in the programs. This marks the continuation of an existing agreement which was first initialted initiated in 2015.

This agreement will generate revenue of \$1,904,574 in tuition and contact hour reimbursement revenue. Eastfield will pay Boettcher Brewery Consultant LLC the maximum amount stated above, thus leaving a net revenue of \$803,334.

Background: The Journeyman Brewer Program has directly partnered with over 18 local breweries that provide live learning labs at their facilities for 40% of the instruction, with the other 60% of instruction happening at Eastfield through a traditional classroom setting. The current program has graduated over 70 students in four semesters of offerings (Summer 2015, Fall 2015, Spring 2016, and Fall 2016). It boasts a 98% job placement rate and a retention rate of over 90%.

The Journeyman Brewer Certificate provides an opportunity for students to gain experience in the day-to-day brewing operations. Students are exposed and immersed into all aspects of the brewing practices, including but not limited to, mashing, wort production, fermentation, hop dosing, filtration, and packaging. When successfully completing the Journeyman Brewer Program, students will have a working knowledge of brewing technology as well as related equipment use.

The Technical Brewer Certification program is an advanced educational program in Brewing Technology and Brewing Operations Management. It is tailored to the needs of Production Leadership in the Brewing Industry. This certificate provides the necessary theoretical and operational foundation to be successful and efficient

in brewery management. The certificate consists of two courses; Applied Brewing Science and Advanced Brewing Practices.

The Sensory class provides an opportunity for the student to gain knowledge and understanding into the principles of sensory evaluation of beers, learning to recognize the various styles of beer and their aroma profiles, in working brewery environments. Upon completion of the course, the student will have a working knowledge of beer profiles, beer aroma guides, and the various tools of sensory beer evaluation.

The Sensory class will feature both open and closed enrollment for community members and local businesses who need to train their staff in the science of brewing craft beer.

PayScale reports that Brew Masters earn salary from \$30,000 to \$51,000 annually, with an average annual salary of \$37,500.

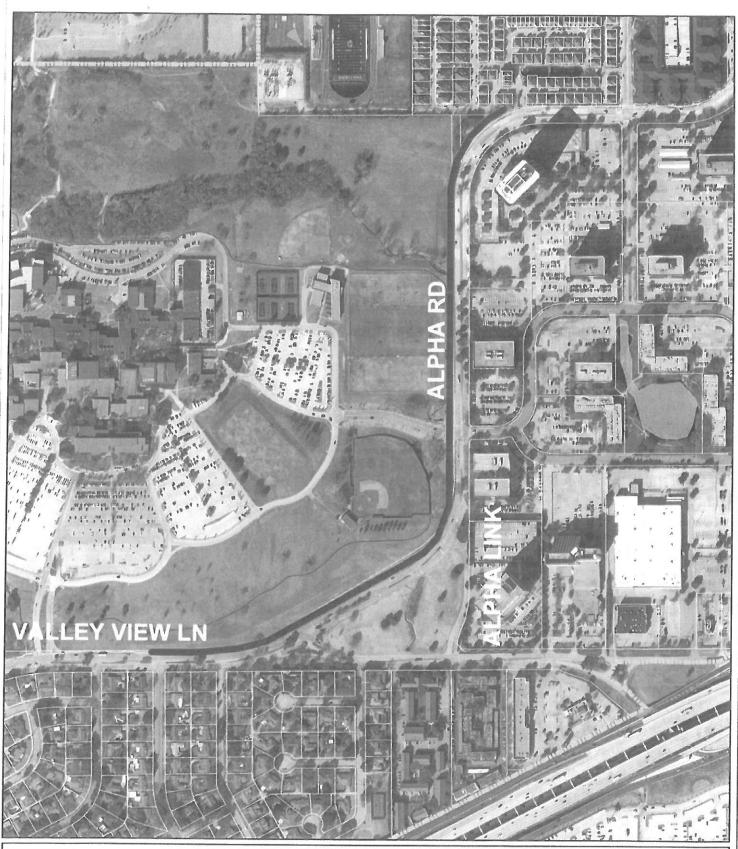

POLICY ITEM - FIRST READING NO. 9A

Approval of Amendment to Policy Concerning Thematic Priorities and Strategic Objectives – BAA (LOCAL)

As a result of the December 2, 2016 Board Planning Session, the following amendments to the thematic priorities and strategic objectives of the College District are proposed.

The Chancellor recommends that the Board amend policy BAA (LOCAL) only as follows:

Effective date: UPON BOARD APPROVAL

BOARD LEGAL STATUS POWERS, DUTIES, RESPONSIBILITIES BAA (LOCAL)

THEMATIC PRIORITIES AND STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES The Board endorses and supports the Coordinating Board's goal plan for higher education: to promote access, affordability, quality, success and cost efficiency in higher education. Closing the Gaps by 2015.

In line with that goal, the The focus of the College District shall be increasing educational attainment as delineated in the Coordinating Board's 60x30TX Strategic Plan plan for higher education (at least 60 percent of Texans between ages 25 and 34 will have a postsecondary credential or degree by 2030). The plan in effect at the time of adoption of this policy is titled Closing the Gaps by 2015.

On an annual basis, prior to the commencement of the planning, budget, and resource allocation process, the Board shall review the mission and purpose of the College District and establish strategic priorities to guide the work of the College District and its colleges. Those priorities shall be framed within four primary themes: student success, community engagement, institutional effectiveness, and employee success. The mission of the College District is to transform lives and communities through higher education. The overall purpose of the priorities will be to ensure that Dallas County is vibrant, growing, and economically viable stable for current and future generations.

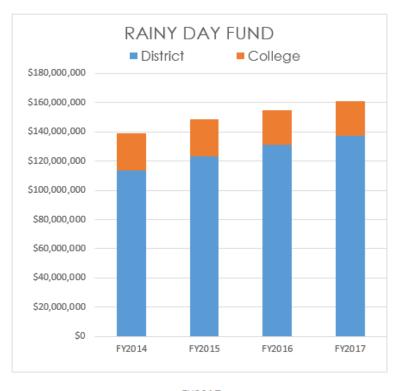

Presentation of Rainy Day Fund

The chancellor presents the District's Rainy Day Fund report for review.

The following chart indicates the dollar amount in the fund as well as the number of months of operation covered by the fund. The District maintains approximately four months of annualized expenses. Each college maintains approximately one month of annualized expenses. The Rainy Day Fund will only be accessed in case of extreme financial emergency as agreed upon by the Chancellor and the Chief Financial Officer and approved by the Board of Trustees.

According to the Board policy on Rainy day fund BAA (Local) Management of College District Funds, item 3: The College District will maintain a prudent amount of un-designated fund balance – equivalent to not less than four and not more than six months of operating expenses – to ensure continuity in case of catastrophic loss and to maintain the most favorable credit ratings for financing debt.

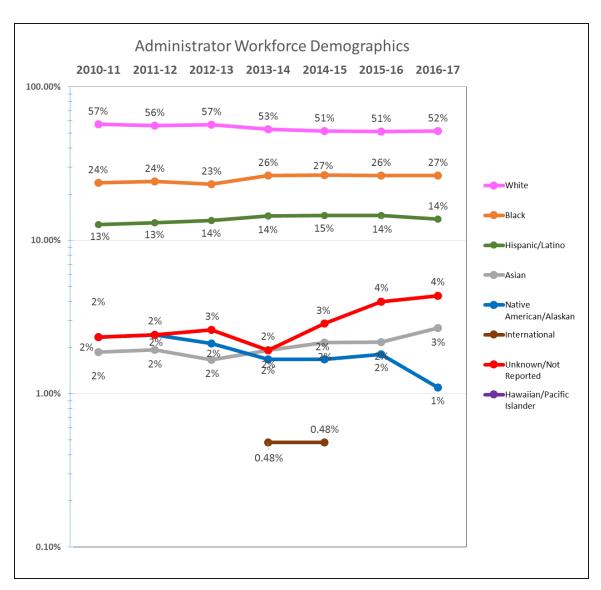

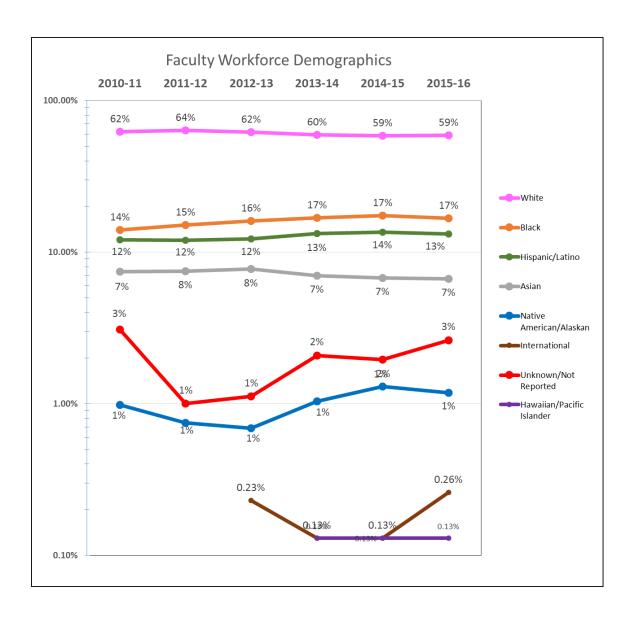

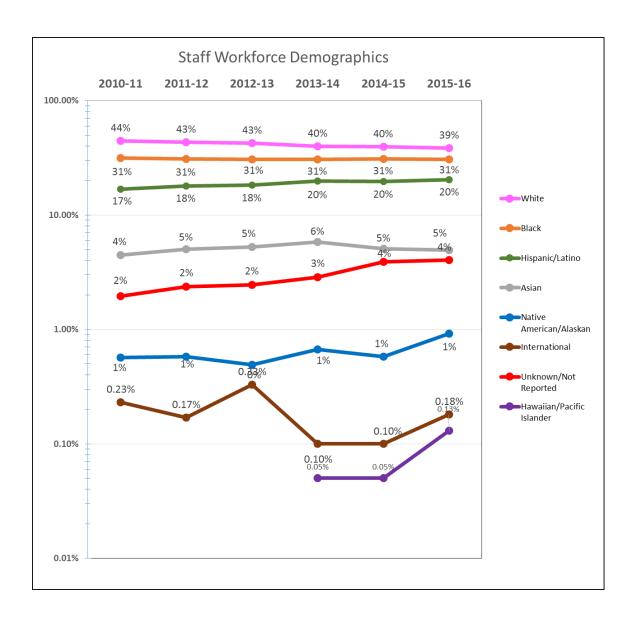
Presentation of Workforce Demographics
